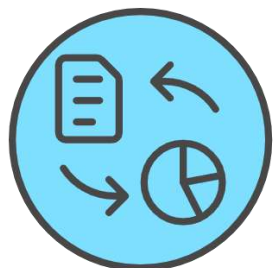

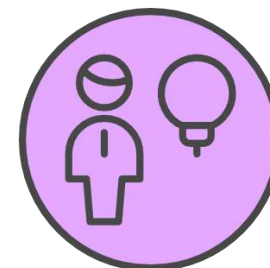


Survey Distribution

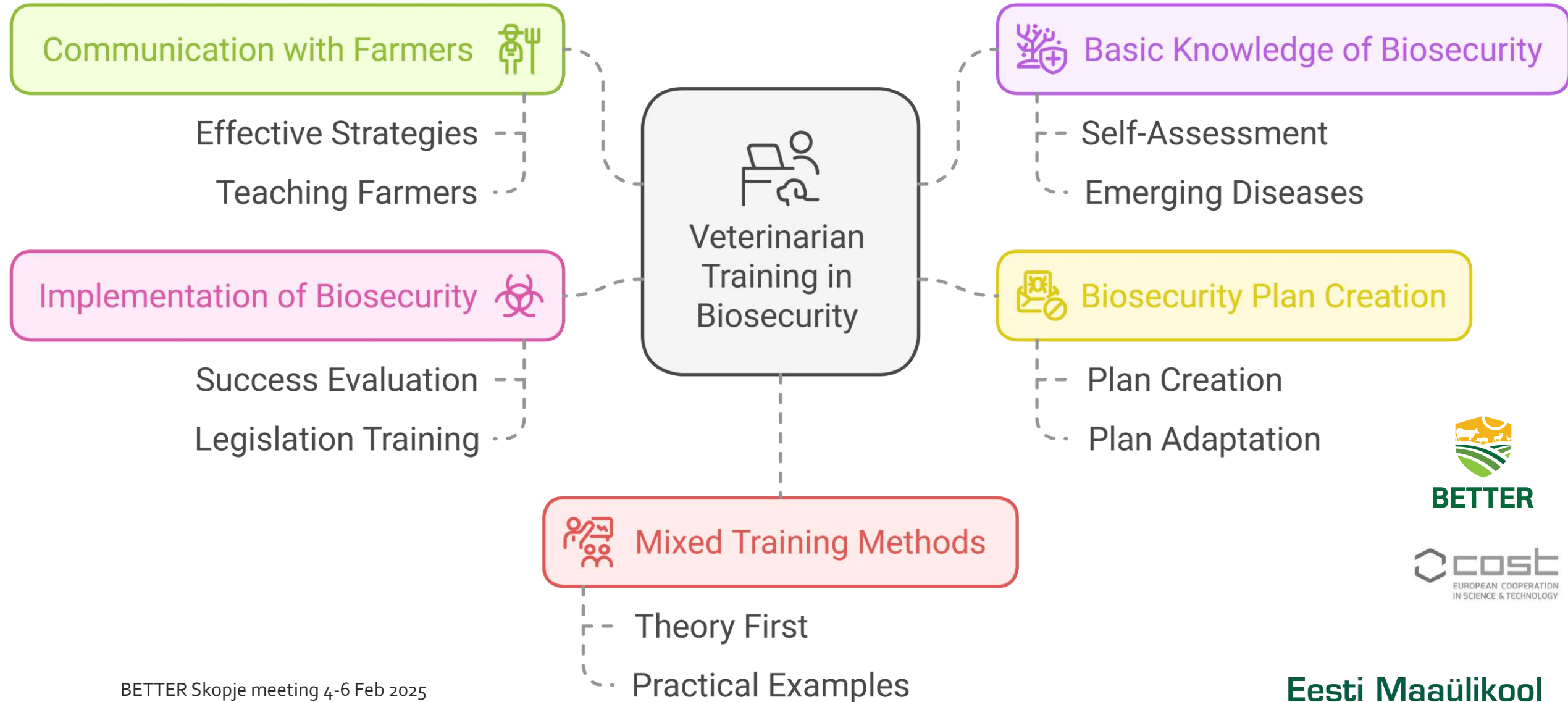

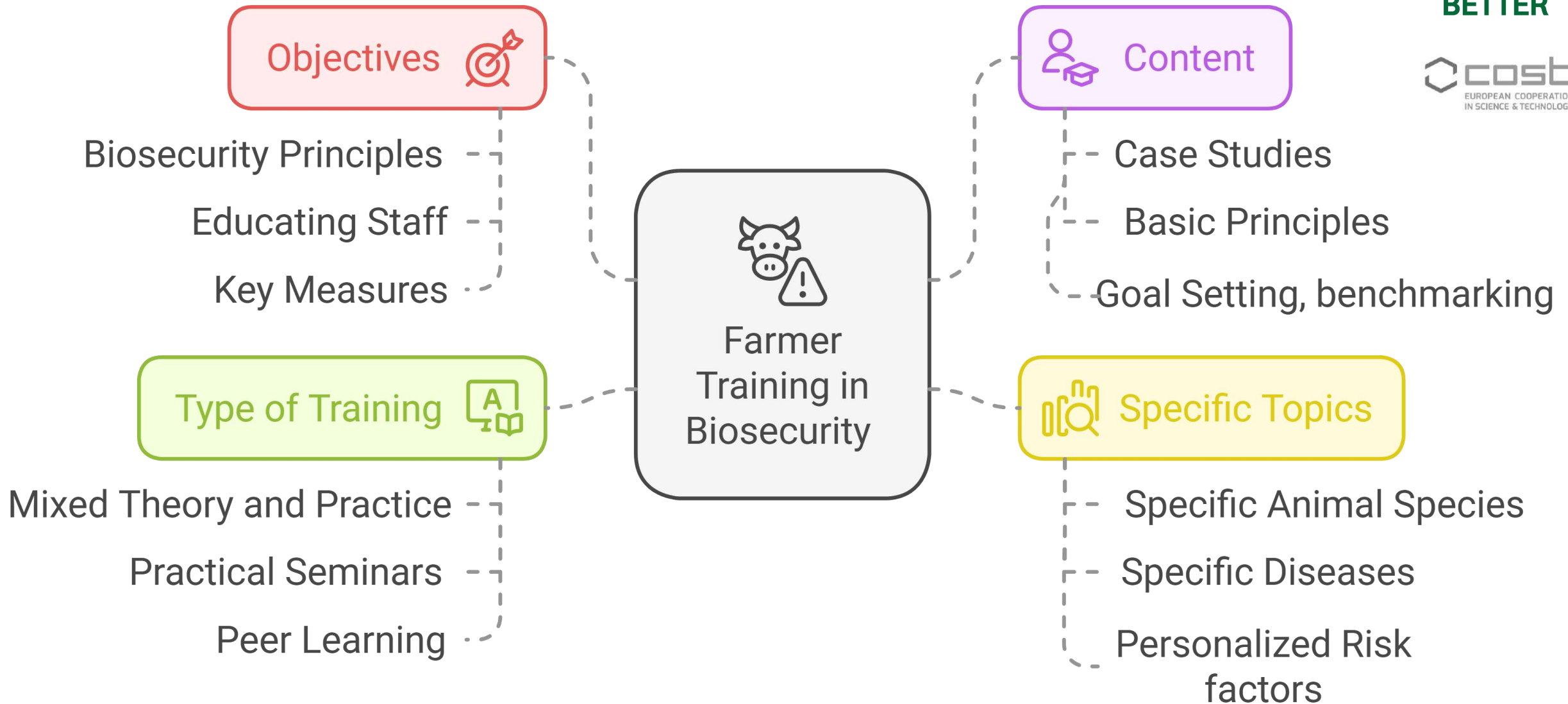

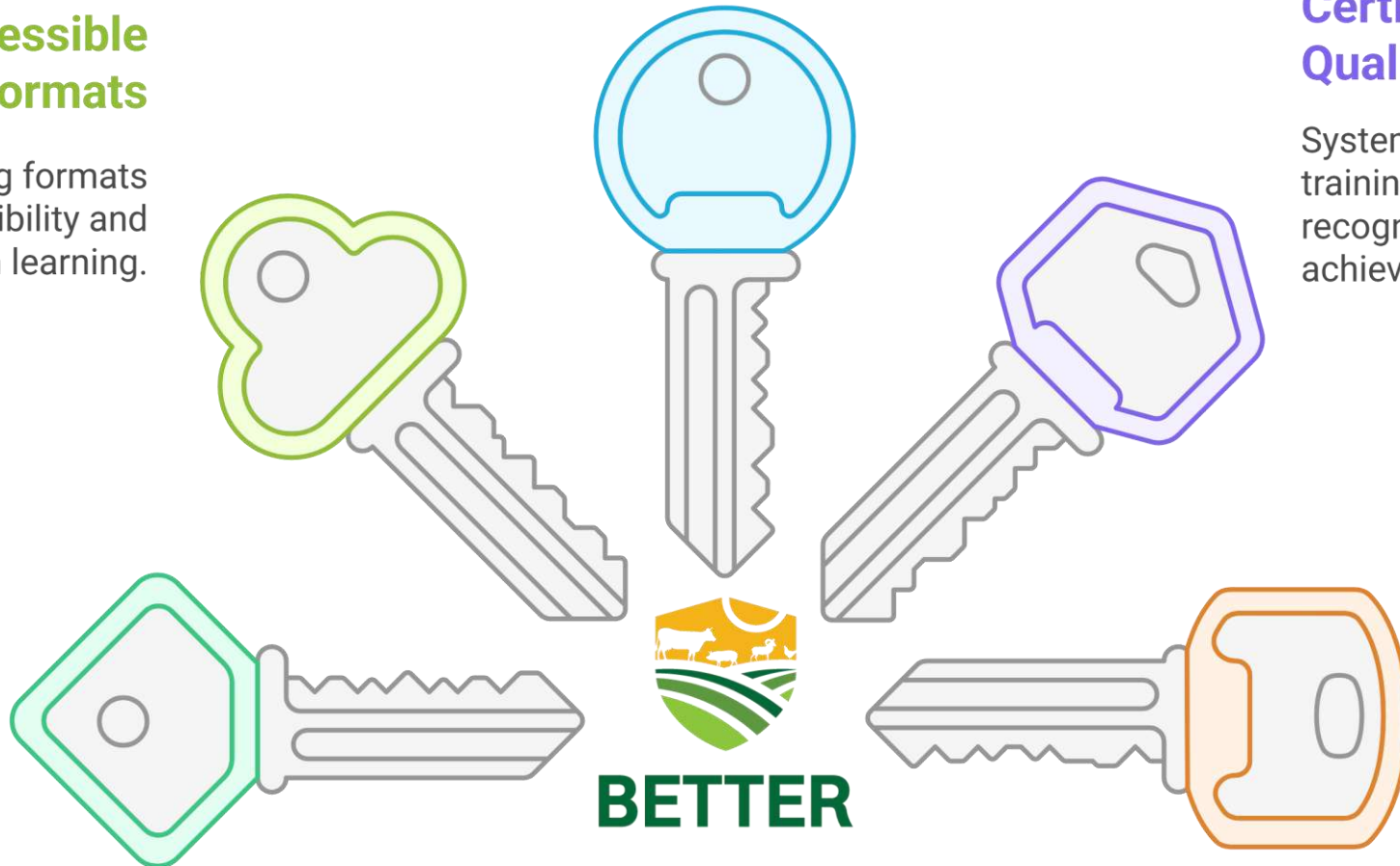
